# AFFIDAVIT OF RON SABO (affirmed February 23, 2023)

I, RON SABO, of the City of Hamilton, in the Province of Ontario, MAKE OATH AND SAY:

1. I am the Deputy City Solicitor, Dispute Resolution, within Legal Services at the City of Hamilton. I have held this role since 2005, other than from March 2022 to October 2022, when I was Acting City Solicitor. As such, I have knowledge of the matters set out below, except where this knowledge is based on information and belief, in which case I state the source of that information and verily believe it to be true.

2. On January 31, 2023, I located certain documents relevant to the matters before the Inquiry that I had saved in my N: Drive, and which, inadvertently, I had not previously identified.

3. Upon discovering these documents, I provided them to the City of Hamilton's Inquiry Counsel and understand that they were processed and reviewed in the usual course. On February 7, 2023, the City's Inquiry Counsel produced the relevant and not privileged documents attached at **Exhibits A-J** (HAM0064464\_0001, HAM0064465\_0001, HAM0064466\_0001, HAM0064467\_0001, HAM0064468\_0001, HAM0064469\_0001, HAM0064470\_0001, HAM0064471\_0001, HAM0064472\_0001 and HAM0064473\_0001).

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4. One of the documents I located in my N: Drive was an email I sent to Nicole Auty on January 21, 2019 (HAM0064469 0001). As part of that email, I wrote:

Gord is sending the update report on PW items or work pending/work done on the Red Hill via email tonight which may include the CIMA report on stone values etc. But there was discussion of that point as its not clear to Gord after discussion with CIMA reps what the findings are other than inconclusive.

5. I mistakenly referred to CIMA in this paragraph to Ms. Auty. I intended to refer to Golder Associates Ltd., and was referencing the draft 2017 Golder Pavement Evaluation report dated December 17, 2018, which I had received from Mr. McGuire on December 18, 2018 (HAM0054181 0001 and HAM0054182 0001).

6. Another document I located in my N: Drive was an email I sent to Gord McGuire on January 3, 2019 (HAM0064465\_0001). In response to Mr. McGuire's question regarding whether Ms. Auty or I had connected with Brian Malone (CIMA), I informed Mr. McGuire that I had no contact with Mr. Malone and that Ms. Auty was not available to respond as she was out of the country without a City cellphone. This email is consistent with my recollection that Ms. Auty was away for some duration in the lead up to the January 23, 2019 Council meeting.

7. I make this affidavit for use in the Red Hill Valley Parkway Inquiry.



The minorly edited in camera report is ready for signature. Due to GIC it wasn't until late in the day that I was able to speak to Gord, Mike, Dan and Edward. If you haven't read other emails I confirmed with Clerks staff there was no prior FOI request that would have required the Tradewind report to be produced, leaving the answers given to press over the years as an issue.

Gord is sending the update report on PW items or work pending/work done on the Red Hill via email tonight which may include the CIMA report on stone values etc. But there was discussion of that point as its not clear to Gord after discussion with CIMA reps what the findings are other than inconclusive. We need to look at that report as its already past deadline for PW on Feb. 4<sup>th</sup>. It also doesn't seem that the Tradewind report is part of this open report. A lot of the surface issues are moot given pending resurfacing, so the report will discuss the plans for that (rolling work crews etc) as well as lighting. I don't get the impression we will have a lot of time for review but I can flip it to David Boghosian in case he has comments.

Mike also wanted to know who you need for the in camera session in front of council.

Lastly Edward Soldo has another report going to the same Feb 4 meeting (it is in your email), responding to a council request to look at speed reduction. It basically has staff recommending a portion of the Red Hill for an 80 kmh speed, but includes the expert report (CiMA again) that finds the speed is ok at 90 throughout LINC and Red Hill. Staff based recommendation on collisions and flexibility allowed for that in CIMA models (Though CIMA was obviously aware of collision history), and that the only location, under one of those models, raised a lower speed was a shorter portion of Red Hill (also 80kmh). It makes sense to have the lower speed apply over a longer segment and ending at the QEW as it makes it easier to enforce and get compliance as opposed to short segments and speeds going up and down). The CIMA report is helpful generally as they find the models all support the same or even higher speeds in some locations but overall finds the 90kmh is appropriate under the 3 best applicable models.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the meeting of February 13, 2019, Hamilton City Council approved Report PW19014 which included the following recommendations:

That the existing speed limit be reduced to 80 km/h on the Red Hill Valley Parkway from the Greenhill Interchange to the Queen Elizabeth Way;

That Hamilton Police Services be requested to continue to undertake regular speed and aggressive driving enforcement on both the Lincoln M. Alexander and the Red Hill Valley Parkways, and that the results be reported annually to the Public Works Committee as part of the Hamilton Strategic Road Safety Program Annual Report.

In response to the request and in consultation with the City, the Hamilton Police Service (HPS) is proposing to implement an interim enhanced enforcement initiative to increase enforcement along the Lincoln M. Alexander Parkway (LINC) and Red Hill Valley Parkway (RHVP).....The 12-week program would utilize use Voluntary Paid Duty (VDP) officers to implement a two-pronged roadway safety approach, combining zero tolerance enforcement, with a high visibility police presence, to educate the public of the ongoing safety initiatives.

The HPS recommend that a longer-term solution that features a robust and sustainable model of enhanced enforcement on these two roadways be developed. The solution may include the deployment of a dedicated traffic enforcement unit and should be assessed within the context of the City-wide Vision Zero Action Plan as well as the potential implementation of Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE).

As <u>Since</u> the use of ASE is currently limited to designated school zones and community safety zones where the prescribed speed limit is less than 80 km/h, and whereas given the LINC and RHVP do not qualify for the ASE program, it is recommended that a request be made to the Province to exercise its authority and implement the necessary legislative changes to authorize the City to utilize-use ASE on the LINC and the RHVP.

Staff is requesting a 2019 Tax Operating Budget amendment with zero net levy Impact to be funded by the Red Light Camera (RLC) reserve account #112203 for a one-time transfer of \$150K (actual costs recovered by the police will be based on actuals, not to exceed \$150K) to the Hamilton Police Services to fund increased speed enforcement on the Lincoln Alexander ParkwayLINC and the Red Hill Valley ParkwayRHVP. Staff have reviewed the RLC Reserve forecast to ensure that funding can be supported from the reserve

Staffing: There are no staffing implications related to this report.

Legal: Bill 65 amendments to the Highway Traffic Act permit municipalities to utilize use ASE in school zones and in community safety zones where the prescribed rate of speed is less than 80 km/h, and to reduce speed limits on roads with statutory speed limit of 50 km/h by designating areas (by by-law) where speed limits may be lower. The amendment does not allow for ASE on the LINC and RHVP, as those two roadways have speed limits that are higher than the 80 km/h. Additional legislative amendments are required to authorize the enforcement of ASE on the LINC and RHVP.

#### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The City has been—evaluating and assessing the roadway safety of the LINC and RHVP through a number of recent reports, including Bill 65 - Automated Speed Enforcement (PW19002), Hamilton Strategic Road Safety Program and Vision Zero Action Plan 2019 (PW19015), City of Hamilton Annual Collision Report - 2017 (PW19012) and Speed Limit Reduction Feasibility Study on the Lincoln M. Alexander and the Red Hill Valley Parkways (PW19014).

Hamilton City Council approved the reduction of the speed limit to 80 km/h on the RHVP from the Greenhill Interchange to the Queen Elizabeth Way on February 13, 2019.—\_The new speed limits wasere implemented on February 17, 2019.—\_Motorists were made aware of the changes through the installation of oversized speed limit signs, advance advisory information signage and the use of flashing variable message signs.

The City has been monitoring speed limit compliance on the RHVP since the reduction te 80 km/h..., It has been and has identified that the 85th percentile speed, the speed at which 85 percent of motorists are travelling at or below, has reduced to an average of 85 km/h.

This is a reduction of approximately 7-10 km/h since the pre-speed limit reduction from statistics in January 2019 and a reduction of approximately 20-25 km/h since 2015.

The City and HPS also launched a new education campaign targeting speeding fast drivers as part of the Vision Zero Action Plan. Over the month of March, the education campaign focuses on promoting safe speeds, reminding motorists that with the slegan "There's no such thing as speeding a little – speeding is speeding".—The campaign is being promoted using print media, radio ads, online advertising, billboards, bus ads,-and social media.

Speeding in excess of the posted speed limit is responsible for a high percentage of injuries and fatalities resulting from motor vehicle collisions. Controlling vehicle speed can prevent collisions from occurring and can reduce the severity of injury when they do occur, especially when vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists are involved. Appropriate vehicle speeds allow motorists more time to stop, reduce stopping distances and lessen the likelihood of a collision.

#### POLICY IMPLICATIONS AND LEGISLATED REQUIREMENTS

Additional legislative amendments are required to authorize the use of ASE technology on the LINC and RHVP as the prescribed speed on those roads is not less than 80 km/h. which is the current requirement for the use of ASE. Once Provincial regulations for the implantation implementation of ASE are established, and the program is operational, in order to implement ASE in the City of Hamilton, amendments to the <u>City's</u> existing Traffic By-law would also ill be required to designate <u>LINC and RHVP</u>eertain areas as a Community Safety Zones and implement ASE.

#### RELEVANT CONSULTATION

This report has been written in consultation with staff from Legal Services, Finance and Hamilton Police Services.

## ANALYSIS AND RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION(S)

On February 20, 2019, through Report PW19014, Council directed staff to request additional support from the HPS, particularly as it relates to a targeted enforcement campaign for speed, aggressive driving and distracted driving on both the LINC and the RHVP.-\_HPS and City staff met on a number of occasions to develop an implementation plan.

The HPS continues to develop strategies that will aid in educating and enforcing road safety on the LINC and RHVP. The goal in these initiatives is to reduce aggressive driving, speeding, collisions and to ensure compliance with newly implemented speed limits.

HPS currently patrols the LINC and RHVP as a component of its annual Traffic Safety Strategy. This deployment <u>utilizes-uses</u> officers from the Central Breathalyzer & Drug Recognition Evaluator Unit, when <u>they are</u> not engaged in impaired driving related investigations. In addition, Divisional Patrol Officers and Divisional Safety Officers may conduct enforcement when <u>they are</u> not engaged in priority calls for service, or other community related traffic complaints.

As an interim enhancement option to the current deployment model, the Hamilton Police Service is proposing to implement a Voluntary Paid Duty (VPD) initiative for a 12-week timeframe until the initiation of the resurfacing projectof the RHVP begins.—The <u>VPD</u> initiative would be subject to potential staffing complications based on the voluntary nature of the assignment.

The enhanced enforcement model would consist of two additional officers per day, working two subsequent shifts a day, seven days per week. These officers will be strictly dedicated to <u>speed enforcement on</u> the RHVP and the LINC, resulting in a marked uniformed presence from 9:00 AM - 9:00 PM, between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. daily.

The initiative would have a two-pronged approach, combining zero tolerance enforcement, with a high visibility police presence, to educate the public of the ongoing safety initiatives. All related statistics will be tracked and shared with the City.

The total cost of the enhanced enforcement initiative for a 12-week duration is approximately \$150, 000.

It should be noted that the recommended staffing and projected costs above, are subject to the voluntary nature of the VPD program. As such, the HPS may not be able to fill every available paid duty, and the total costing may be lower than projected. As spring and summer months arrive, there will be increaseding demands on the VPD program, inevitably diminishing the potential to staff this initiative.

The HPS recommends that a longer-term solution that-featuringes a robust and sustainable model of enhanced enforcement on these two roadways be developed. This may include the deployment of a dedicated traffic enforcement unit, as currently given the HPS does not currently have the capacity to staff a dedicated enforcement unit without additional funding.

In 2017, the Ontario legislature passed Bill 65, the Safer School Zones Act, which amended the Ontario Highway Traffic Act (HTA) to among, other things, authorize the municipalities to use ASE technology (known as photo radar) as a tool to address vehicle speed concerns and collision patterns involving speeding.

As identified through Report PW19002, while the <u>ASE amendments</u> regulations related to the use of <u>ASE</u> underto the HTA will allow municipalities to use <u>ASE</u> in designated

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school zones and community safety zones where the prescribed rate of speed is less than 80 km/h. The LINC and RHVP fail to meet the Provincial criteria for community safety zone designation given that those roads have a prescribed rate of speed that is not less than 80 km/h, and therefore do not qualify for the use of the ASE program.

It is recommended that a request be made to the Province to exercise its authority and implement the necessary legislative changes to authorize the City to <u>utilize-use</u> ASE on the LINC and the RHVP.

The development of the long-term enforcement solution should be assessed within the context of the Vision Zero Action Plan and potential automated speed enforcement initiative.

City staff will report back to Council with options for consideration.

## ALTERNATIVES FOR CONSIDERATION

In order for the speed limit reduction on the RHVP to be effective, an enhanced enforcement initiate is required.—\_While City staff will be working with the HPS to determine a long term solution, the alternative for Council is to not implement the enhanced enforcement initiative and rely on the existing Traffic Safety Strategy.
